Lesson 1 – Climate of Revolution	
Boycott	An act of protest in which a person/group refuse to use, buy from or deal with an organisation or person.
Lesson 2 – The Emergence of NICRA	
Unionist	Those who wish to keep Northern Ireland part of the United Kingdom (usually of Protestant religion).
Nationalist	Those who wish to have a united Ireland achieved by non-violent means (usually of Catholic religion).
Republican	Those who are opposed to British rule in Northern Ireland and wish to have a united Ireland.
Civil Rights	These ensure a citizen's ability to fully participate in the civil and political life of a country without discrimination.
Royal Ulster Constabulary	The name of the police force in Northern Ireland from 1922 to 2000. It became the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) in 2001.
Loyalist	An Ulster Loyalist is commonly a Unionist who is opposed to Irish Republicanism and Nationalism. Loyalists strongly favour a political union between Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
Lesson 3 – NICRA's Formation and Demands	
Social Activists	Those who take part in actions such as demonstrations or strikes to bring about social change.
Gerrymander- ing	The process of dividing an area into electoral districts in order to give a political party a majority.
Disbandment	The process of breaking up an organisation.
Sectarian	Discrimination or hatred arising from a narrow minded view of another group/religion.
